Every year, all Alaska public school students (grades 3-8) take the Standards Based Assessment tests. **We will conduct testing next week (April 1-4). Friday, April 4th we will have a full day of school (8:30- 3:30).**

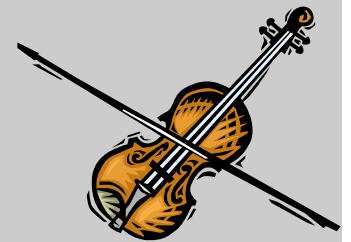


5th Grade Honor Choir-
