IN RETROSPECT

Several times over the course of this school year, I have recalled the very first day of my Waldorf teacher training at Antioch New England Graduate School. All 24 of us credential-seeking candidates were seated in a circle, as our speech teacher slipped something to one of us saying, "This is a gift for you." He instructed us to receive the gift from the person to our left and to give it to the neighbor to our right. The gift was a rock, one that he had doubtlessly picked up on his way into the room.

I distinctly remember thinking that I didn't get it. In fact, I held it of so little significance that I forgot about it for many years. Until just recently. I was observing a lower grades class. After having heard a story, the children were handing out materials for main lesson seat work. Some children placed crayons and books on desks carefully, while others tossed and slid them to their classmates. Inside, I was crying out, "These are gifts! They ought to be handled with care!" That's the moment I remembered the rock. "I get it!", I thought.

It wasn't about the rock. We teacher candidates were learning how to give and how to receive. We were learning, in essence, about gratitude and thankfulness. Waldorf journeys all begin that way: in giving. Paths are cleared by visionaries who found schools. An inordinate amount of work goes into manifesting these visions. Buildings are erected, school supplies are ordered, and teachers are trained. Waldorf educators continually strive to give and to receive the highest quality education. The work is endless, as is the joy.

What emerged from the ring of teacher candidates on my first day of Waldorf training was much more profound than what lay on the surface. We learned to acknowledge even the smallest of acts--the giving of a dull rock--as a gift. This is the season when I realize how many small acts have gone into the school year. How many lessons have been prepared; how many songs sung; how many stories told and verses recited; how many lunches packed; how many clothes laundered; how many heads of hair combed and brushed; how many trips to school driven; how many stitches knitted, crocheted, crossed, or sewn; how many soups prepared and dishes washed; how many painting papers prepared; how many meetings attended; how many instruments carted; and how many hours volunteered. For these, and the endless list of other gifts, I heartily give thanks.

On behalf of the entire staff, I extend complete gratitude to you, parents, for entrusting your children to us at Birchtree (T for thankfulness). I give thanks to my colleagues for receiving the children in love. And lastly, I thank all the children at our school who, in their own ways, teach us all.
