**ROSE CEREMONY** 

One of the many cycles in Waldorf schools occurs at the beginning of each school year: the Rose Ceremony. This occasion marks the first day of first graders' journey through eight grades. It also marks the last time eighth graders begin their school year at Birchtree. First grade children and their parents eagerly, perhaps nervously, anticipate what lies ahead for them on this day. The Rose Ceremony helps to welcome them on a grand scale, prior to the very first of what will become hundreds of main lessons.

Mrs. Busbey calls the names of a first grader and an eighth grader. They walk toward one another, meeting in the middle. The eighth grader extends a hand for the first grader to shake. Then the older student presents a rose, along with a quiet wish for a wonderful school year, to the younger student. Inevitably, the eighth graders are always surprised at how little the first graders are, and then quickly realize that they, too, were once that young and small. These students will remain "buddies" throughout the year, meeting occasionally to share activities with each other at designated times throughout the year.

Just before eighth grade graduation, we hold another ceremony with these same students. At this Rose Ceremony, it is the first graders who extend hands for the eighth graders to shake before giving each of their big buddies a rose and well wishes for the future. This day completes the cycle of giving and receiving, in much the same way that seeds are planted and then harvested. It is beautiful to behold the growth of all of these students over the course of one year, and commemorated by the rose-giving.

#### Johndro's News Journal

Welcome back!!! I am so excited to be teaching 5<sup>th</sup> grade this year. We are going to have lots of fun. There is so much to learn! We are starting out the year with Botany and will spend much of the year focusing on ancient civilizations. As Botany involves a lot of outdoor study, we should be going on our first field trip at the end of August! This year due to budget concerns, we must ask parents to pay 8.00 for the bus. Please come and see me if this is a financial hardship.

Homework is an important part of learning. The homework that the children have will be daily, it is suggested that they establish a regular routine and have a quiet place to work. I will not grade homework, simply check that it is completed. Those who do their homework on a regular basis may receive an extra privilege, perhaps a free time or extra painting time now and again.

As we are doing less reading in class it is suggested that the children read for 20 minutes every night M-TH and that the parents initial the calendar in the students planner. I will check the planner on Fridays. I discussed with the students that they could skip a night and add about 7 minutes on each other night if they would like.

I will also begin the year with the students writing a paragraph each week to put into their main lesson books on Friday. We will begin the writing in Sept.

I will also have a few vocabulary words each week, the children should know how to spell them and what they mean. We will go over the definitions in class . They will have a quiz on Fridays.

The children will also be responsible for finishing any work that they are unable to finish in class. They will have regular math homework once we get going on Go Math

The students will also have a few German vocabulary words each week, they are expected to practice their violin and may need to bring knitting home to keep up on their projects.

I love your support and enthusiasm, thank you for trusting your children to my daily care and education. I just love my class!!!
