Early Release Part 4

In my last article, I mentioned that specific traditions come with becoming a Waldorf school. I referenced our school's mission, which is very similar to most other Waldorf schools' missions. Even the day on which teachers meet is quite uniform in Waldorf schools. As promised, what follows is part of the reason why.

The days of the week have long been associated with the planets (and their influences), beginning with their names. This is most readily seen in the romance languages: luna-moon-Monday; martes-Mars-Tuesday; miercules—Mercury—Wednesday; jueves—Jupiter—Thursday; etc. In his large body of research and written works, Rudolf Steiner furthered the study of the planets' influences of the days of the week and gave indications for each. He recalls Jupiter, our largest planet, as representing the ruler of our thought life. Just as Jupiter can be seen from a great distance, Steiner associated Thursday with a clear line of vision. In addition, organizational goals are set with greater consideration for the good of a whole group. Steiner acknowledged that the mercurial nature of Wednesday would result in quick ideas that were easily subject to change. Friday, representing Venus, is associated with emotional, rather than logical, thinking. Steiner saw Friday, then, as a good day for building relationships more than for making decisions toward reaching goals. Therefore, he consciously chose Thursday to be the most productive of days for Waldorf school faculties to meet as academies providing leadership and vision for their schools.
