As I indicated last week, the staff at Birchtree works with virtues central to the school's mission and identified by the acronym TREE: Thankfulness, Responsibility, Empathy, and Excellence; all rooted in the ground of respect. To reflect upon responsibility is to realize how the Waldorf curriculum aims to create a habit of being reliable, trustworthy, and accountable.

This work begins in the kindergarten. Because kindergarteners are imitative, teachers are tasked with providing models worthy of imitation. Children are taught to hang up their coats, place shoes neatly in their cubbies, put toys away, set and clear the table, rinse their snack dishes, and how to fold large cloths. One of the goals for kindergartners is to develop a habit of being responsible in these areas.

In the primary grades, children are still imitative, but decreasingly so, and teachers continue to be models for them. Teachers lead by example, using a quiet voice when that is expected of his/her students, writing slowly and carefully in main lesson work, and handling conflict in a kind, truthful, and just manner. Students are assigned classroom chores, to be done at the end of each and every day. These chores hold each student responsible, in part, for smooth functioning of the entire class.

The hope is that by the middle and upper grades, healthy student habits have been established. Around 10 years of age, Waldorf students are expected to have gained a sense of responsibility. They have developed initiative of their own, after years of will-development, to do what they are relied upon to do. As pre-adolescents wend their way closer toward adulthood, they often yearn for greater privileges. Responsibility becomes the leverage for these privileges, since the rite of passage to adulthood truly centers around the "ability to respond"--responsibility. Teachers look for their students' ability to assume increasing responsibility for their main lesson work, such as self-editing; to be relied upon to accomplish tasks without repeated reminders; and to own their mistakes and misdeeds. Children of this age now rebel, rather than imitate, providing some of the greatest challenges in our "ability to respond".


