

### **Dear Parents of Birchtree Orchestra Students:**

We are looking forward to our Spring Concert! It will be held at 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist Church (1150 E. Helen Drive) in Palmer on Tuesday, April 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:30 p.m. This church is located on the hill behind the Noisy Goose Cafe and across from the state fairgrounds.

Our twice-yearly orchestral concerts are an integral part of our music program. They are a culmination of the work done throughout the school year and serve as an opportunity for students to demonstrate their learning. The group dynamic in orchestra is a learning opportunity for both personal and community growth. The successful performance of the group depends heavily on every member being present. Therefore, student attendance at the concerts is expected and mandatory. If there is a significant reason why your child cannot attend, it is crucial that you inform Mrs. Eddings in writing as soon as possible so she can arrange an alternative performance opportunity.

In order to have the best success, we will have a rehearsal field trip on site the afternoon of the concert, April 21<sup>st</sup>. It will be held at 1<sup>st</sup> Baptist Church from 12:30pm until 2:30pm. Students will be bussed to and from the church, leaving Birchtree at 12:00pm and arriving back at 3:00pm. We will be leaving all instruments at the church to be tuned after the rehearsal. \*\*\*PLEASE RETURN the enclosed permission slip to your classroom teacher no later than April 14. If your student will be riding separate from the bus, please also include the liability waiver and insurance forms. Parent volunteers are greatly needed to help set up chairs prior to student arrival and also to help with crowd control during the rehearsal. Please let Mrs. Eddings know if you plan to be there so she can plan accordingly.

That evening, students should arrive at 6:00 p.m. for tuning. Concert dress for students should be in keeping with this special event. Boys should wear dress pants and a dress shirt. Girls should wear dress pants, a skirt with a dress shirt, or a comfortable dress. We request no dresses or shirts with bare shoulders. We also request that students do not wear jeans or t-shirts. To facilitate a smoother overall program, students are going to be seated with their classes during the concert.

The students have worked very hard and we look forward to sharing a night of beautiful music with our Birchtree families.
