Harald Blomberg, MD is the creator of RMT and a psychiatrist in Stockholm, Sweden. He has been investigating the link between retained infant reflexes, learning ,emotional imbalances and motor skills since the 1980s. Dr. Blomberg has taught BRMT across Europe, North America, Australia and Asia. And runs a clinic in Stockholm.

Kate Wagner, MA. Kate is a licensed Blomberg Rhythmic Movement Training Instructor and Brain Gym Instructor. She has 18 years teaching experience in private and public school systems. She presents to groups and travels to teach classes for school systems and individuals. She is a BRMT International Distributor and has over 500 hours of training with Dr. Blomberg. She is editor of all his manuals and books.

What you will learn: Level 1

In the 2-day introductory course - Rhythmic Movement Training and Primitive Reflexes, participants learn the basics of BRMT: how movements can be used to assist in regulating muscle tone and stimulating the connections between parts of the brain, especially as they relate to impulse control and attention. Some topics included in this course...

- The Triune Brain and Development
- Development and Identification of Reflexes
- RMT Active and Passive Movements
 - Reflex tests and Integration Techniques

RMT brings integration and balance to people of any age with learning obstacles (including ADD/ADHD, dyslexia, and dyspraxia), coordination difficulties, emotional and behavioral challenges, CP, Autism Spectrum Disorders and many other disability areas. Including issues associated with the elderly.

This sensory stimulation supports a strong flow of nerve impulses from the brainstem, through the limbic system, to the frontal lobes - three critical areas of brain activity – to creating meaningful change in learning, attention, emotions, cognition and motor skills.

What you will learn: Level 2, The Limbic System

The course deals with reflexes that specifically affect our emotions and emotional regulation: the Fear Paralysis reflex, the Moro reflex and the Tendon Guard reflex. It is a necessary tool for anyone who wishes to work with rhythmic movement training. Participants will learn movements to support the connection from the limbic system to the prefrontal cortex and techniques to modulate emotional responses.

Some topics included in this course...

Emotional Development, Moro and Fear Paralysis Reflexes Tendon Guard Refles and Spinal Pereze Reflex Motor Function and the Limbic System Autism, ADHS and emotional self-regulation

How to Handle Emotional Reactions to BRMT Previous knowledge required: BRMT level 1
